VIRTUAL MEETING WITH CHANDIGARH UNIVERSITY INDIA



This week on 16th July 2021, i-PUTRA hosted another fruitful engagement session between Ondokuz Mayis University (OMU), Samsun Turkey and the Faculty of Agriculture along with the Faculty of Engineering, UPM. This engagement session was meant to explore the potential of future collaborations in partnership between UPM and OMU.

OMU is an established State University founded in 1975 to contribute and bring a new breath to the Black Sea region (where they are located) in the field of economic, cultural, and social life. 
